Academic Workload Steering Group – Terms of Reference

Academic Workload Framework

The Academic Workload Framework (AWF) was launched in March 2017 and was the product of a joint working group between the recognised academic union, EIS, and the University. The joint working group agreed that an AWF Steering Group would oversee the implementation and ongoing operation of the framework.¹

Purpose of the Steering Group

- Support consistent implementation of the AWF across all Schools
- Monitor the application of the framework, in particular ensuring that workload is transparent and that workload allocations are fair and equitable
- Discuss and approve amendments to the core framework
- Approve variations to the core framework allocations of +/- 10%
- Encourage consistency across Schools
- Encourage good practice sharing across different Schools
- Review and provide feedback on local (School) workload allowances
