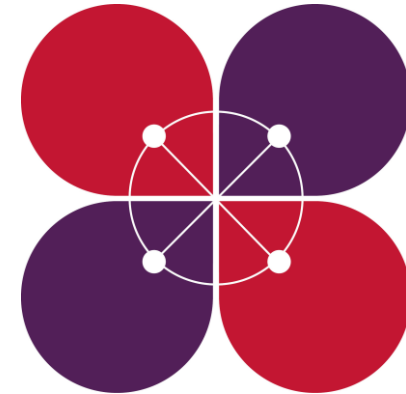

Curriculum Management Project

Working towards a launch date of a new system to replace the module descriptor task and paper programme specifications from September 2022.

Seeks to better integrate business planning, quality and operational aspects of curriculum development and the processes around this

What do you need to know?

- Currently configuring the system to hold all our curriculum records.
- Will be migrating all our live module descriptors and programme specifications to the new system.
- We are creating workflows that will support our new approval, change and closure processes.
- Asking Module and Programme Leaders to check the new records before they go live.
- Will integrate with SITS but the record will be managed through the Curriculum Management System
- Benefits: version control, visibility, ease of access, focus on learning outcomes/mapping, collaboration

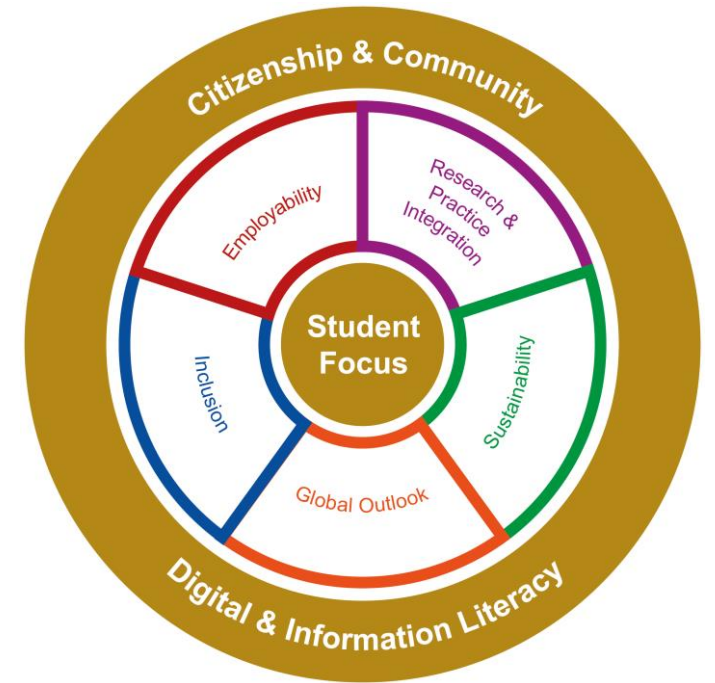
Gold Standard Curriculum Framework

The Gold Standard Curriculum (GSC) Framework is a new curriculum enhancement tool, designed as a starting-point for programme team and university-wide conversations about curriculum design.

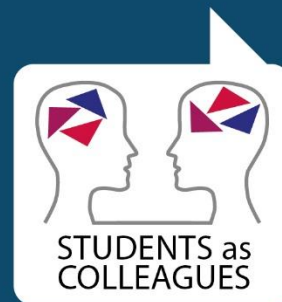


Key updates

Health & Safety

Entering campus

- Face coverings must be worn while moving around campus and in all communal areas, unless exempt
- 1m social distancing in all teaching spaces and whilst moving around the university
- Wash/sanitise hands on entering and leaving campus and frequently throughout the day

Teaching spaces

- Do not modify room layouts
- When moving around wear face covering and maintain 1m social distancing
- Wipes to be collected by staff and students – wipe down desk when entering and dispose in bin at end of class
- Wipe down contact points you have touched (Academic)
- Keep windows and doors (where possible) open

Offices

- Face covering to be worn if moving around, maintain 1m social distancing
- Wipe down shared surfaces before/after use

Health & Safety

Use of facilities

- Toilets – face coverings, maintain 1m social distancing, wash/sanitise hands
- Communal kitchens – face coverings, 1m social distancing, sanitise appliances before/after use
- Libraries – face coverings and maintain 1m social distancing

Corridors and lifts

- Face coverings, 1m social distancing
- Avoid stationary meetings/conversations in corridors
- Keep to left
- Use stairs if possible to avoid queuing at lifts at busy times (max capacities)

- Evacuate using nearest exit, maintain 1m social distancing where possible inside building

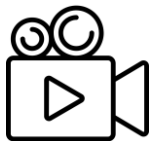

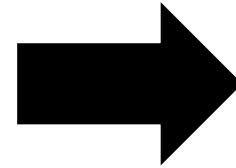

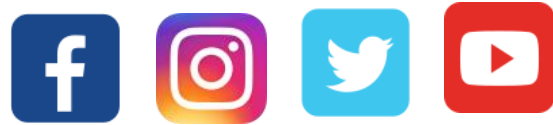

& Check In



Background and approach

- Both Student Check In and Student Engagement Reporting are designed to support student wellbeing and help the University with its safeguarding obligations.
- Allows us to identify more easily and consistently students who may be struggling with their studies so we can offer support.
- It is not attendance or engagement monitoring, it is not meant to be punitive. It is not linked at present to outcomes/progression.

Check In to class

- Check In has been in place for the last year with a focus on campus teaching to support Test & Protect – we are now re positioning this.
- Students should Check In to confirm attendance at any timetabled learning event taking place on campus, at one of our other teaching venues or online.
- Students should Check In via the Edinburgh Napier app or by visiting myaccount.napier.ac.uk – its quick and easy to do.
- For more detail go to My Napier at my.napier.ac.uk/your-studies/check-in-to-class. You'll also find a video there that shows students how to Check In.
- Please encourage students to Check In at the start of each learning event you host. You can see who is checking in, in real time, on the Edinburgh Napier app. For more detail look on the Staff Intranet staff.napier.ac.uk/services/school-support-service/Pages/Student-Check-In.aspx





Check In data – what are we using it for?

- Student engagement reporting is a way the University can identify and support students who have disengaged with their studies. One of the systems we look at is Check In so please encourage student to only check in if they are attending the event, we are using the data to support them in their studies and to help support their welfare.
- For students studying on an international VISA, they need to use Check In as part of their conditions of studying with us, we use the data as part of supporting evidence that we can share with UK Visas & Immigration.



Student Engagement Reporting

- Student engagement reporting has been developed to support student engagement and wellbeing.
- The report looks at whether students have used various systems, including Check In, Moodle, library loans and Resource Booker.
- If they haven't used any of the systems for two weeks or more a member of staff, usually their Personal Development Tutor, will get in touch to check everything is OK and offer support.
- It's building on our responsibility to act on knowledge we hold by pulling together usage information from multiple systems into one place to allow us to pick up on potential issues in a quick and consistent way.

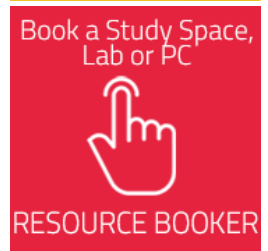

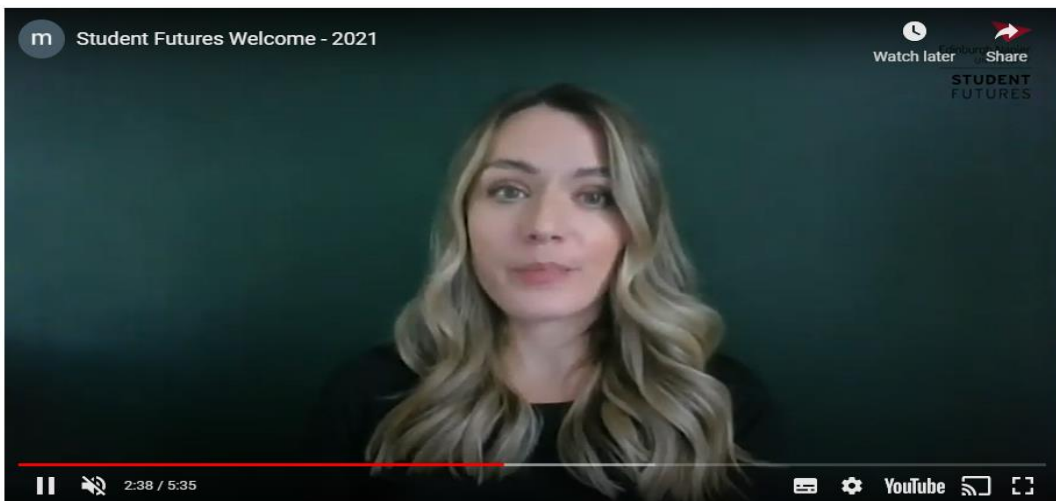


