### **Entry Requirements**

A Bachelor's degree with Honours at 2:2 or above OR an ordinary degree in nursing with distinction where registration is in an alternative field to the one you are wishing to study.

In addition applicants must also have National 5/GCSE grade C/4 in Maths and English, or equivalent, and 500 hours of relevant work experience (equivalent to 12-14 weeks full-time in a service user context).
