

# Consent form for 'ChatGPT and Me' Amnesty Padlet: Tell us what you think anonymously

This project aims to collect and analyse student attitudes to artificial intelligence (AI) and their own learning and assessment while they are studying with Edinburgh Napier University. AI tools such as ChatGPT are developing and make it easier to generate outputs, such as text, which could use either in whole or part to create work which students use for their own learning or submit as their own for assessments. Very little is known about students' attitudes towards these tools - whether they see them as legitimate aids for refining their own work, developing their own skills for the future workplace, or a threat to the value of their learning and degrees.

In this research we will use an 'Amnesty Padlet', where students can post their experiences and thoughts anonymously about this topic. They can also read vote up or down students' anonymous posts. The contents of these posts will be the data for the research. The data will

4. I also understand that if at any time while posting on Padlet, if I feel unable or unwilling to continue, I am free not to complete the task. That is, my participation in this study is completely voluntary, and I may withdraw from it without negative consequences. After I have submitted my post on Padlet, I will still be able to return and delete my post at any point until the Padlet is changed to non-editable when the data is being analysed.
5. I have been given the opportunity to ask questions regarding the project and my questions have been answered to my satisfaction.
6. I have read and understand the above and consent to participate in this study. My agreement is not a waiver of any legal rights. Furthermore, I understand that I will be able to keep a copy of this informed consent form for my records.
