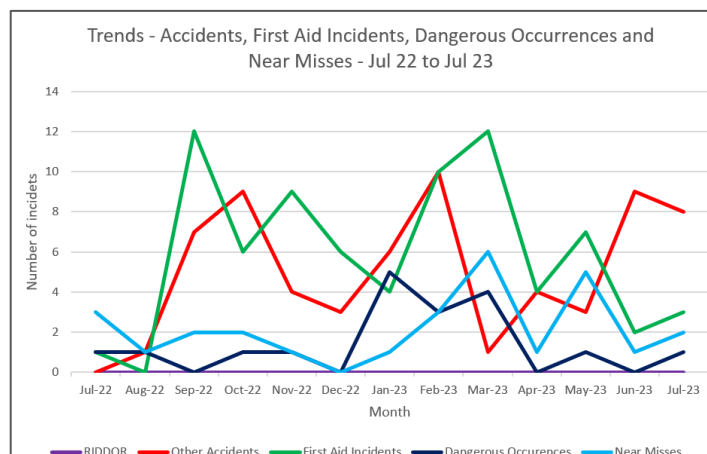

All staff are required to complete:

- Workstation module annually
- Fire Safety module every 2 years
- Health & Safety Induction – once-off completion

Automatic reminders are issued from the system

Line Managers

Line Managers are asked to review completion of these mandatory modules at the end of year My Contribution reviews and to encourage staff to ensure they are up to date with their training

Line Managers are also asked to ensure that they action and close-off any concerns raised in the Workstation assessments by staff they line manage ([Guide on updating/closing-off concerns](#))
