Role Summary:	As the senior Competent Person appointed under the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999, the role provides professional leadership, advice and direction within the University to ensure it provides a safe environment for its staff, students and visitors, meets its statutory health & safety obligations and supports the delivery of the University strategy.			
	Key responsibilities are to lead the Health & Safety Team and to engage effectively with senior management, academic Schools, professional services (particularly Property & Facilities, Student Wellbeing & HR teams) trade unions, students and other key stakeholders to ensure the maintenance and development of an effective health & safety management system to control and mitigate health and safety risks, promote a positive health & safety culture and ensure compliance with legal obligations.			
	The role will also provide key support to the University's emergency and business continuity planning framework, supporting the establishment, review and rehearsal of appropriate emergency and crisis response procedures and plans.

Lead the University's health & safety response for any incidents that occur within the University Emergency Response Procedures including the current Covid-19 pandemic and advising the University Leadership Team appropriately.

Responsible for ensuring that the University Court, Senior Management, and staff at all levels within the University are fully informed and aware of their legal and moral obligations under the HASAW Act, 1974 and all associated Health and Safety (HSE) Codes of Practice and Guidance, other relevant Statutory Provisions, and civil law.		
To provide specialist advice on health, safety and fire safety with regard to the University's residences and buildings and liaise with the University's Property & Facilities team and contractors to ensure that the premises and new works comply with all relevant legislation.		
Evaluate the University's health and safety accreditations to ensure the University meets high quality and relevant standards such as ISO.		
Development		
Lead the development of the University's Health & Safety policies and procedures and ensure these are compliant and updated to respond swiftly to changing health and safety legislative requirements and recognised good practice guidelines in relation to health and safety matters. Audit these policies and procedures on a regular basis to ensure they are fit for purpose.		
Manage a programme of University-wide Health & Safety communications and campaigns that are engaging to staff, students and other key stakeholders.		
Foster a culture of continuous improvement in relation to Health & Safety across the University, encouraging all staff, students, contractors and visitors to adopt and maintain safe working practices.		
Foster a culture of Health & Safety planning across the University, particularly in relation to the early developmental phases of research, capital and refurbishment projects, working closely with Property & Facilities and Technical teams.		
Leading the development and delivery of programmes of monitoring and performance measurement to provide assurance that the University continues to operate in a safe manner.		
Training		
Leading the development and delivery of effective health, safety and fire training to support policy implementation across the University, including delivery of IOSH accredited courses and student /staff induction, research and specialist health and safety seminars, fire safety training for all staff and students.		
Oversee and co-ordinate activities of health and safety groups/forums within the University and support staff with specific health safety and fire responsibilities by establishing requirements and maintaining a comprehensive consultation / information/ training / support strategy for Safety Coordinators, Risk Assessors, Fire Wardens and Senior Fire Coordinators.		
Compliance		
Ensuring the effective oversight and maintenance of the University's arrangements for compliance with all statutory health, safety and fire requirements, including (but not limited to) fire safety, biological safety and radiation protection.		

Ensuring the provision of appropriate statistical data and other management information to University committees and other appropriate bodies in relation to Health and Safety matters, including accidents, exposure to harmful agents, incidents and investigation reports. Responsible for forward planning to anticipate the impact on the Higher Education sector of novel hazards, techniques, and issues, and their predicted impact on the University, whilst ensuring that resources to meet these challenges are deployed on the basis of reasonable practicability and value for money.
Accident /incident/complaints investigations and reports
Ensure that detailed investigations of all accidents, incidents and complaints are carried out and that reports are prepared for both internal and external use, including use by insurers, by enforcing authorities and in legal proceedings.
Attend emergency incidents as required and assist in the management of these.
Compile the University accident statistics and report and arrange RIDDOR (Reporting of Diseases and Dangerous Occurrence Regulations) notifications when required.
Fire safety Management
Lead, monitor and review the implementation of University fire precautions and procedures including fire risk assessment and scheduled evacuation drills for both campus and residential developments, and the development and review of the fire warden scheme.
Lead the process of risk assessment and development of personal emergency evacuation plans for staff and students with mobility difficulties.
Monitor unwanted fire activation calls and provide statistics for internal and external use. Liaise with external bodies (Fire Authority) on a regular basis.
Emergency Resilience
Provide leadership and support to the University's emergency and business continuity planning framework, supporting the establishment, review and rehearsal of appropriate emergency and crisis response procedures and plans.
 Meetings and Liaisons
Responsible for establishing and maintaining effective professional relationships with Enforcing Authorities (HSE, Local Authority, SEPA, SFRS) on behalf of the University, in order to protect the University's interests, in terms of legal compliance and the reputation of the University.
Representing the University through various external professional bodies e.g. regulatory authorities and professional networks at local and national level.
To work with School/Service Safety Committees, Safety Co-ordinators and Trade Union safety representatives to develop and enhance health and safety within the University.
