## **Role Summary**

Working in the Psychology Labs at Edinburgh Napier University, the successful candidate will play an integral role in externally funded research by the British Academy, the Leverhulme Trust, and the Carnegie Trust of the Universities of Scotland investigating aspects of multisensory perception.


Under the supervision of Dr Nikos Gkekas and Dr Duncan Carmichael, the post holder will help to set up and run a series of perceptual experiments investigating visual statistical learning and colour adaptation, recruit participants to the study, collect and manage data, and assist with analysis and interpretation of results.

In conjunction with psychophysical experiments, the post holder will also make use of functional near-infrared spectroscopy (fNIRS) at the University's lab.


