| Number of users | Unlimited. |
| Mobile friendly (online) | Very good reading experience on iPhone viewed landscape; and on iPad/iPad mini. |
| How much can I download? | A chapter (without images) at a time can be saved to disc as txt file or web page. |
| Full book download | No. Use Airdrop, or similar, to add to reading list on mobile devices. |
| Kindle download | No. |
| How much can I print? | No limit if it is for personal, not commercial, use. Double-sided printing possible. |
| Email link/social networking options | Can email link or jumpstart (links at top of chapter). |
| Search within chapter | Use browser search functionality. |
| Make notes | Set up an account, then a project. Log in to make notes at book/chapter level. |
| Reference tools | No. |
| Export to EndNote | Log into MyWorkspace. Open project containing saved searches. Select items to export. Click Export. Select EndNote. On networked pcs on campus, "save and open" causes EndNote desktop to open. Otherwise, save the file as .enw or .ris and import into the online version of EndNote; or email the file to your Napier email and import into EndNote desktop version when on campus. |
| Read aloud | No. |
| Password system | Use your Edinburgh Napier login (EZproxy). |
