You can import another user's notes by clicking Import and inputting the token they have given you. You can share your notes by clicking Share to get a token. When reading online, use the Add notes button at the bottom left of the screen, and export using the Notes button on the top ribbon. When ebooks are downloaded to VLebooks eBook Reader , add notes using the ribbon icon at the top right. To email notes, click Bookmarks. Notes can only be emailed until the expiry of the download period.
