What type/classes/fields of information are collected	Information will be collected from COPD patients from the general public via survey and, where participants volunteer, interviews which will take place subsequently via telephone or using Microsoft Teams.

How is the information being collected	The information is being collected via an online survey and, where applicable, recorded interviews.
Is personal data shared with externally	An external company called 1st Class Secretarial Services will transcribe interviews. The University has a data-sharing agreement in place with this organisation to ensure that all data is kept secure. How secure is the information	For services provided locally by Information Services, information is stored on servers located in secure University datacentres. These datacentres are resilient and feature access controls, environmental monitoring, backup power supplies and redundant hardware. Information on these servers is backed up regularly. The University has various data protection and information security policies and procedures to ensure that appropriate organisational and technical measures are in place to protect the privacy or your personal data. The University makes use of a number of third party, including "cloud", services for information storage and processing. Through procurement and contract management procedures the University ensures that these services have appropriate organisational and technical measures to comply with data protection legislation. The University is Cyber Essentials Plus accredited.
Who keeps the information updated	The researcher.
How long is the information kept for	All audio data will be securely destroyed once electronic versions have been created according to University's data management guidance. All copies of the physical data collected at the research sites will be kept until 2 year after completion of the study.
	Research data will be stored on the University's X drive. The University-managed data storage is resilient, with multiple copies stored in more than one physical location and protection against corruption. Daily backups are kept for 14 days and monthly backups for an additional year.
